



The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans District 2) is proposing to conduct pavement preservation from PM 22.4 to PM R29.4 on State Route 36 in Lassen County. State Route 36 is a 2 to 5-lane conventional highway that serves as the MainStreet in the City of Susanville, California.

THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDE:

- Overlay Pavement
- Drainage System Replacement
- ADA Ramps (In compliance with the American with Disabilities Act)

BACKGROUND

On April 2016, Caltrans met with local stake holders to review alternatives for this project, taking into consideration traffic operations and related data.

The purpose of this project is to preserve and extend the life of the existing pavement and improve ride quality, as the road currently shows signs of distressed pavement and as a consequence, poor ride quality.

Construction is expected to begin the 2018 construction season.
